Chemical Health Pre-assessment Team

Regulation 5631 C

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I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this regulation is to establish the chemical health pre-assessment team required by policy and law.

II. TEAM ESTABLISHMENT AND PROCEDURES

A. The membership of each school's multi-disciplinary pre-assessment chemical health team shall include:

1. Classroom teachers;
2. Administrators;
3. Other school personnel, which may include the following as appropriate and to the extent they may exist at the school:
 - (a) School nurse
 - (b) Counselor
 - (c) Psychologist
 - (d) Social Worker
 - (e) Athletic Director
 - (f) School Resource Officer
4. District resources, such as :
 - (a) District Licensed Alcohol and Drug Counselor
 - (b) Safe and Drug-Free Schools Staff

B. The principal or designee will report the membership of the pre-assessment team for the school to the appropriate associate superintendent and the Safe and Drug Free District staff on an annual basis by October 1st of each school year. In the event that the team established is known by a name other than the "Chemical Abuse Pre-assessment Team" or "Chemical Health Pre-assessment Team" at the school, the principal or designee will notify the appropriate associate superintendent and the Safe and Drug Free District staff of the title used by the school for the team when the membership is reported.

C. The team will follow the procedures identified and published on the district's website for pre-assessment teams.
